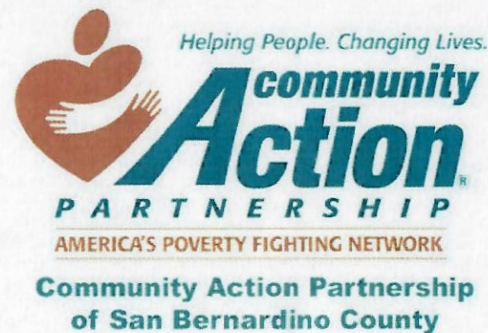
## Mobile Food Pantry


The WCSD has been approached by Alejandro Montes, a mobile food pantry coordinator at Community Action Partnership of San Bernardino County (CAPSBC). Alejandro is responsible for creating a new program which will increase food assistance to low-income communities through a Mobile Food Pantry. They hope to support disadvantaged communities through bi-weekly or monthly mobile pop-up food pantries, which will be operated by their staff. CAPSBC is currently out-reaching in San Bernardino County, and is looking for Partners with suitable locations to host the Mobile Food Pantry. The WCSD is being asked for its' support in letting them utilize the Hollis Stewart Park of the Community Bldg. Pending the CSD's approval, they will begin to provide food support beginning this Fall 2021 through Fall 2022.

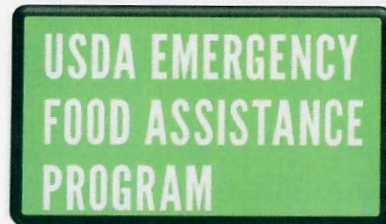

# Food Programs



The Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP) provides USDA food commodities to local food banks, which work with a network of local food pantries to distribute to eligible individuals and households. Clients are eligible to receive USDA commodities one time each month without payment or any restriction placed upon the receipt of commodities. Approved non-profit organizations are sub-recipients of the food bank and host a monthly USDA food distribution at their site.



Congregate feeding sites provide prepared meals in a group setting. This type of meal service allows persons in-need to eat a nutritious meal while enjoying the companionship of friends and other members of the community. The congregare feeding program creates or supports existing soup kitchens throughout San Bernardino County by providing a monthly menu of foods.



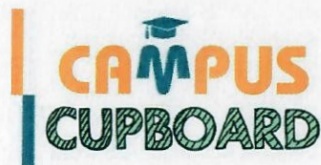
# Food Programs



The Community Pantry Program encompasses any food item or product donated in-kind to the food bank program with the intent of supporting the needs of the community. Non-profit organizations are contracted with the food bank to operate a community food distribution. All products are provided to nonprofit organizations and the community at no-cost or fee.

## Senior Choice Nutritional Program

Many seniors face barriers related to mobility, technology, income, and social stigma that may prohibit them from seeking or receiving service. The Senior Choice Program is designed to circumvent such barriers to service by working directly with senior centers or low-income senior housing complexes to host healthy food distributions.



The Campus Cupboard Program works to alleviate the barriers and challenges associated with food insecurity and hunger amongst college students, to encourage them to remain in school and achieve their educational goals and degree. CAPSBC seeks to provide support and resources for campus food pantries serving students in the form of food and personal hygiene products.

# Mobile Food Pantry Program



Our Mobile Food Pantry Program will seek to serve predominantly rural areas in San Bernardino County. Aiming to deliver 5,000 pounds of food, (roughly equates to 100 households), to underserved neighborhoods that have a high incidence of poverty and lack consistent access to full-service grocery stores or other sources of fresh and healthy food.

We provide Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP) prepackaged food boxes, meats, fruits, and vegetables. Additionally, it will also include other commodities such as toiletries, diapers, clothing, school supplies, etc., contingent on availability.
